- 0.2. Only in Semitic words.
- 0.3. Never word-initially.
- 0.4. ɻ occurs after ɻ v to indicate vu, and before ' y to indicate uy instead of oy.
- 0.5. Occurs after initial ' y to avoid confusion with ey, and occurs after vowels.

- 1.1. *y* before or after a vowel; *i* between consonants; *y* after **ט t**, **ទ d**, **ס s**, **ז z**, **ל l**, **נ n**; and before a vowel indicates the palatals in words of Slavic origin.
- 2.1. See note 1.1.
- 3.1. *j* before or after a vowel; *i* between consonants; *y* after **ט t**, **ទ d**, **ס s**, **ז z**, **ל l**, **נ n**; and before a vowel indicates the palatals in words of Slavic origin.
- 4.1. In unstressed positions pronounced as [ɛ] or [i], depending on dialect.
